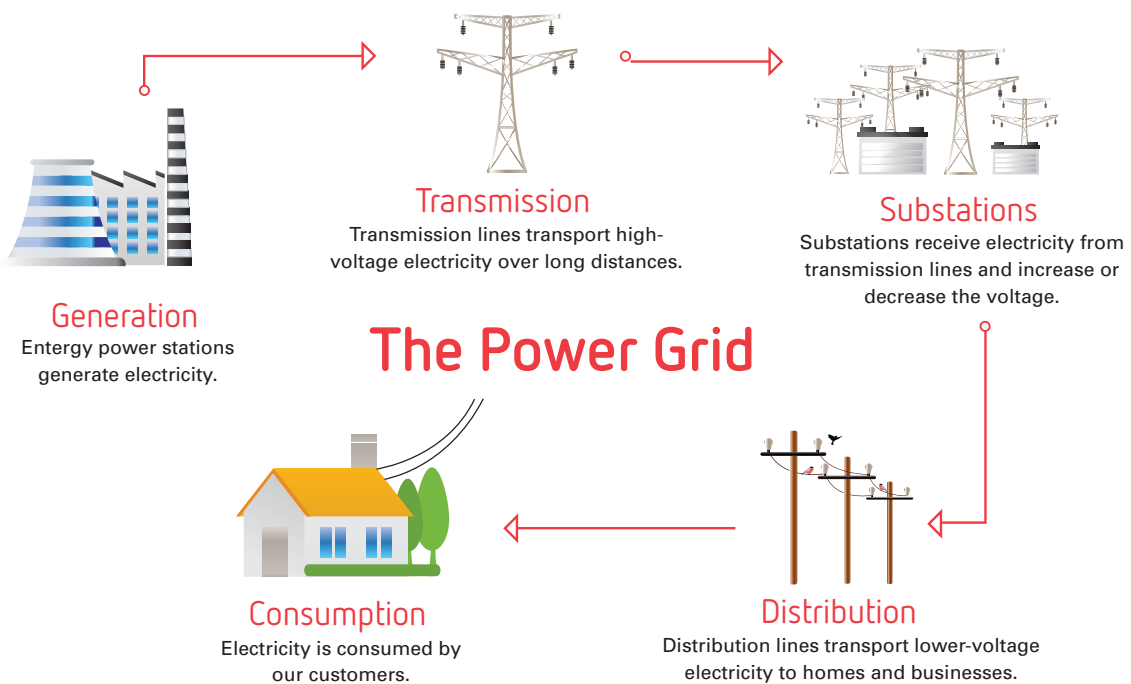


The future of Texas depends on efficient, reliable energy infrastructure. This infrastructure network, also known as the power grid, is comprised of transmission and distribution lines, substations and transformers. These lines are the “roads” that deliver electricity to our customers, and the substations tie the transmission and distribution systems together.

We’ve made significant investments to strengthen Texas’ infrastructure to meet the growing needs of our residents and businesses for years to come.

Some of the improvements include:

- Adding **new transmission and distribution lines** to the more than 16,000 miles of lines managed by Entergy Texas.
- Replacing wooden poles with **stronger composite material** to test for strength and longevity as part of a pilot program.
- **Adding capacity to circuits** so our customers can receive power from alternate sources.
- **Replacing** aging underground facilities.
- Sustained tree-trimming and vegetation-management efforts throughout the **approximately 15,000 square miles** managed by Entergy Texas.



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
