Making a difference in Arkansas communities

Volunteering is one of the most important ways Entergy employees power life in our communities. In 2022, employees in Arkansas dedicated more than 25,292 hours of volunteer service valued at more than \$757,495.

Activities included:

- Hunger relief support through statewide food pantry donations and volunteerism.
- Improving literacy and education through Academies of Central Arkansas, Single Parent Scholarship Fund, and school programs across the state.
- Providing adequate and safe housing through financial and hands-on support for Habitat for Humanity.
- Supporting workforce programs for minorities and women to help them achieve greater success.

Stepping up to help with bills

Higher than usual temperatures last summer drove record energy usage, and this, combined with higher natural gas prices and storm recovery costs, produced higher electric bills.

To help ease the burden, Entergy Arkansas worked closely with community agencies on a series of measures including more than \$1.2 million in shareholder contributions that provided \$150 bill credits for eligible customers, fee waivers, and more than \$1 million in donations to nonprofits that provide emergency bill payment assistance for elderly and disabled customers through The Power to Care and other programs.

Entergy Arkansas employees teamed up with partners to complete several energy efficiency projects for low-income customers across the state, and distributed EE kits and information in 40 communities.


Creating sustainable value for Arkansas through philanthropy and volunteerism

Operation Warm

Each year, Entergy Arkansas partners with Little Rock International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) Local 34 to choose elementary schools and provide each student at the school a new winter coat. Dubbed Operation Warm, the project raised enough funds to provide 800 coats to students in December of 2022.





Beat the Heat bill assistance

Entergy Arkansas increased corporate contributions by \$1.8 million and implemented a series of measures to assist our customers and communities during extreme summer heat and inflation. This included more funding for programs that helped qualified customers pay their electric bills, as well as donations of fans, food, school supplies and energy efficiency kits to help families stretch their monthly budgets.





Literacy and education efforts

Entergy Arkansas employees spend hours in schools and aftercare programs across the state, mentoring, reading and helping students achieve their educational goals. Whether it's reading to a class of elementary kids or one-on-one homework assistance, our employees put in the time and effort to encourage young learners. Corporate contributions also go to bolster those efforts with new books and materials for students and teachers, as well as scholarships.





Addressing food insecurity

Hungry bellies are not only painful, but they distract from the important things families need to focus on to live their best lives. By donating dollars and hours to foodbanks across the state, Entergy Arkansas employees address a huge issue in the state, where 1 in 4 people lives in poverty and 17% face food insecurity.





STEAM-focus on students
