Giving back to our communities through philanthropy, volunteerism and advocacy are integral to our corporate mission.

We invest in solutions that attack the root causes of poverty, support education and workforce development, and protect and preserve the environment. In 2022, our shareholders contributed \$27.8 million to non-profit partners across Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas.

Making a difference in our communities

Volunteering is one of the most important ways Entergy employees power life in our communities. In 2022, employees dedicated more than 110,000 hours of volunteer service valued at more than \$3.3 million.

Activities included:

- Working with partners at United Way of Southeast Louisiana’s J. Wayne Leonard Prosperity Center to put families on the path to economic stability.
- Packaging and distributing meals at Mississippi Food Bank and Extra Table.
- Building homes with Habitat for Humanity.
- Community beautification projects with The Woodlands Green Up.

Stepping up to help with bills

Higher than usual temperatures last summer drove record energy use and this, combined with higher natural gas prices, produced higher electric bills.

To help ease the burden, Entergy partnered with United Way agencies and other community partners across a four state area in an unprecedented effort to provide 67,000 customers with \$150 credits and other bill payment assistance.

The campaign included more than \$10 million in shareholder funded assistance for customers including bill payment assistance, weatherization assistance, energy efficiency kits and education.

Nearly \$700,000 donation in sanitizing goods

Entergy's supply chain organization donated more than 8,000 cases of hand and surface sanitizing liquid, spray, and wipes, valued at \$694,000. The supplies were distributed to six community partners in the greater New Orleans area and to the Feeding America Food Network, which serves affiliate food banks across the country.

In recognition of this year's National Pro Bono Week, Entergy employees joined together. On Oct. 27 to help low-income community members during Entergy's second annual Day of Pro Bono Service.
