Making a difference in Mississippi communities

Volunteering is one of the most important ways Entergy employees power life in our communities. In 2023, employees in Mississippi dedicated more than 18,700 hours of volunteer service valued at \$598,000.

Activities included:

- Packaging and distributing meals in partnership with Extra Table.
- Helping children explore and learn through programs at the Mississippi Children's Museum and the Mississippi Museum of Natural Science.
- Partnering with Goodwill Industries to help families recover from the tornadoes that struck Rolling Fork, Mississippi.

Stepping up to help with customers

Higher than usual temperatures last summer drove record energy use and produced higher electric bills. To help ease the burden, Entergy Mississippi extended its Operation Bill Assist campaign, committing an additional \$1.5 million in resources to help customers. The campaign included \$1 million in free energy efficiency kits, more than \$520,000 in emergency bill assistance for older adults and customers with disabilities through The Power to Care, and giving back through 100 community events in honor the company's 100th anniversary. The company also launched a child savings program, provided free legal assistance and donated to non profits to help reduce food insecurity, improve education and address social justice issues.



Our commitment to Mississippi runs deep. For more than a hundred years, we have been caring for our customers and the communities we serve while delivering reliable, affordable power. The communities we serve are also the communities we call home and our customers are also our neighbors.

Entergy volunteers packed 2,500 meals in the first event of a multiphase 100,000-meal commitment.
