Giving back to our communities through philanthropy, volunteerism and advocacy is integral to our corporate mission.

We invest in solutions that attack the root causes of poverty, support education and workforce development, and protect and preserve the environment. Our shareholders contribute \$16-\$18 million annually to strengthen the communities we serve. In 2021, they contributed approximately \$1.5 million to nonprofit partners in Arkansas.

In 2021, our employees in Arkansas engaged in more than 25,200 hours of volunteer service valued at approximately \$721,834.

- Community beautification projects with Keep Arkansas Beautiful.

Creating Cleaner Communities in Arkansas

Entergy Corporation’s shareholders helped protect the environment by contributing more than \$250,000 to three partnering organizations in Arkansas through the company’s Environmental Initiatives Fund. The grants marked the 21st consecutive year that Entergy has earmarked funds at this scale to support the work of these important local drivers of needed environmental progress.
